What is an epiphany? According to the dictionary, an epiphany is:

A usually sudden manifestation of perception of the essential nature or meaning of something. (2) An intuitive grasp of reality through something (as an event) usually simple and striking. (3) An illuminating discovery, realization, or disclosure. B-a revealing scene or moment (Merriam-Webster.com)

Epiphany is a church festival celebrated every January 6. It commemorates the coming of the Magi, as the first manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles or, in the Eastern

Church, the commemoration of the baptism of Christ. Yet Epiphany is so much more than remembering and celebrating the magi visiting the baby Jesus. The season after Epiphany, which goes from the feast day of the Epiphany until the Transfiguration of our Lord, speaks of God being shown to the world and being manifested among God's people. Throughout this season, we celebrate that in Jesus, God is born to us; revealed to us in mysterious, unexpected, and wonderful ways. There is a theme throughout all of the Epiphany gospel readings; Jesus brings new life into the lives of those around him and into our lives as well. Think of how Jesus is being manifested among God's people today.

Throughout this season I encourage you to think about the following questions...

- 1. How did you first come to see Jesus?
- 2. How do you see Jesus now?
- 3. How do you show Jesus?

I first came to see Jesus through witnessing and experiencing how God's love enables us to care for one another. I saw it in the devotion of wonderful teachers of faith; in the faithful example and encouragement from my grandmother and so many others. I have seen Jesus in strangers, in friends and family, all who show and remind me how loved I am. I see Jesus now in all sorts of unexpected, mysterious, ordinary and wonderful ways. I see Jesus when people gather for worship, when we pray for and help those in need. I see Jesus in the many and various ways we live out our calls. Showing Jesus to others can be a challenge for us, especially since we are called to love everyone, including those who are difficult to love; and when we ourselves are feeling broken and unloved. We show Jesus to others in the same ways that we see Jesus ourselves. We show others Jesus when we love one another, when we show up for people with acts of kindness, when we reach out to others in prayer and aid, when we forgive each other.

God continue to use us to show God's love, grace, and mercy with the world. May we keep our eyes, ears, and hearts open to when we are called to step out in faith, that God would use us and our ordinary gifts in extraordinary ways, to show Christ's love with the world God loves so much.

Generous God, throughout time, you have given us people who have shown us the gift of your grace. Inspire us by their faithfulness to serve you and all your people, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. Amen.

January Council Highlights

- 1. Gonzalo (ILO) Romero Lauro accepted an appointment on council and to the Communications Committee.
- 2. Bids from three contractors for the replacement of the sanctuary air conditioners were reviewed and a company was chosen. We will have a special brief congregational meeting on January 30th, after worship for congregational approval.

Covid 19 Updates

As you may be aware, the current Omicron variant is the 14th iteration of Covid-19, which was first identified in 2019. Medical and scientific findings have shown that this is the most infectious and fastest spreading of all the variants thus far. Over the last month, we have seen the number of new confirmed cases increase exponentially.

For the last almost two years, how we do worship during a pandemic has been a main focus of the Worship and Music Committee. Each month, the Worship Committee looks at current data, and looks at guidelines and recommendations from the Office of the Bishop of the Southwestern Pennsylvania Synod, the CDC and the Allegheny Health Department. At times, they also confer with other local Lutheran congregations on their policies, and have found that they are similar. The discussions are long and prayerful, with the health and safety of the congregation being a top priority. Based on their findings, they make monthly recommendations to the council. Council then meets and prayerfully discerns and votes upon the guidelines that are put forth to the congregation, again with the health and safety of the congregation at the forefront.

As a reminder, committee meetings and council meetings are open to all members of the congregation. Worship and Music typically meets the first Tuesday of the month over zoom. If you would like to join the discussion, please contact Linda Ryan. Council meetings are held in person on the second Tuesday of the month. If you would like to be put on the agenda, please contact Charlie Brandt. We are grateful for the time and careful discernment that the committee and the council have used in analyzing this continually changing pandemic for our health.

At the January council meeting, council discussed and prayerfully discerned all things related to the current status of the Covid 19 pandemic and the Omicron variant surge in Allegheny County. Council is continuing to ask all worshipers to mask up in love and respect for others; especially those who are not fully vaccinated, our children and those who are immunocompromised.

We are also asking worshipers to continue keeping a safe distance between families and be mindful of those with different comfort levels while indoors. As we go through the latest covid variants and waves and as we enter the cold and flu season, please take advantage of the live streamed service if you need to stay home. In addition to that, if you test positive for covid and need help notifying people you had close contact with in church, you may call Pastor Jen, and she'll help do so anonymously. We want to help keep everyone safe. Council will continue to be in conversation regarding Covid guidelines each month, as things are always changing.





February 2022 Kantor Korner

For some reason, I have never explained what the word "Kantor" means and why I have chosen the word to define my music ministry here at Nativity. The concept goes back to 18th Century German Lutheranism. A Kantor was a church musician who had theological training. In the sense that I have two master's degrees: one in theology and another in church music, I felt that this word would be a good word to represent what I do. The word is unique to our own Lutheran Heritage. Perhaps, the best known is Johann Sebastian Bach who was Kantor at St. Thomas Kirke [church] in 18th Century Leipzig Germany. German Lutherans spell the word with a "K" in contrast to Jewish synagogues which spell the word with a "C" when referring to a vocal soloist that leads the congregation in the singing of the psalms and other parts of the Jewish Sabbath service.

In light of this coming June, I will have been your Kantor for three years and I must say I have enjoyed the experience of serving a very caring congregation while playing a magnificent German Baroque organ. I too have missed the opportunity since this pandemic began in March of 2020 to direct the choir. We were doing great things in 2018 and 2019 and the overall sound of the choir has improved. And then came COVID. Now we cope with the risks of COVID aerosols in our worship space and hallways.

But this soon will end. It is hard to plan given the numerous setbacks. We have landed on letters from the Greek alphabet from Delta, Omicron, and that's enough. We have been using soloists to provide vocal offerings. Our choir did sing for Pastor Soltis' installation as well as on Christmas Eve. I think we are all praying that this too shall pass so that we can resume rehearsals.

In the meantime, I would like to thank those who have rehearsed and performed: Alisa Michael, Nathaniel Hazelton, Pastor Jim Dollhopf, and Pastor Jennifer Soltis. I am planning to rehearse with other members of the choir as we transition back to full choir rehearsals when it is safe to do so. We certainly have a Godly Heritage and to express this musically has been a real joy. Both Chris and I are so glad to have found you all.




Biblical love notes
