From the Pastor's heart...

Ash Wednesday begins the season of Lent. The spiritual disciplines of lent include: prayer, penance, repentance, or almsgiving (giving to others). Yet it seems as though the most popular is giving up something you enjoy, such as chocolate, sugar, fast food, etc.

The spiritual discipline of fasting can help us grow in our faith, as it should be accompanied by increased and intentional prayer, but the addition of something can also help bring us to feel closer to God. Perhaps you could devote more time reading the Bible; setting aside time each day to spend time in Scripture. There are two opportunities for study during Lent. The six-week

zoom book study with me, (it's not too late to join), classes start Monday March 7 in the evening. Or you may read through the ELCA World Hunger devotional book, which also includes a calendar of different scripture, prayers, questions to think about, and ideas for giving. You can find these resources in the Narthex, or they can be sent to you by request. Perhaps you could be more intentional about prayer; setting aside time each day to pray using a different prayer/meditative practice. Another suggestion is becoming more active in the ministries of the church. If you have any questions or need suggestions on how to get started, feel free to contact me, I'd love to help.

The Lenten season provides us with time for reflection and introspection; it is a journey we take together, moving us towards Holy Week. During our individual and communal time of prayer, God guides us in strengthening our faith.

Faith is a process; a process that takes a whole lot more than forty days. Our faith is a life-long process of patience, prayer and love. We go through this process of faith together, and support and encourage one another.

Perhaps this Lenten season gives us the chance to reflect upon our own lives. To reflect on how our faith is being transformed in our sacred times we have in our prayers to God. Whether those prayers are for hope, strength, encouragement, patience, we know that we have a God who hears our cries for strength, and who sent Jesus Christ to be our light and our salvation.

O Lord God, you led your ancient people through the wilderness and brought them to the promised land. Guide now the people of your Church, that, following our Savior, we may walk through the wilderness of this world toward the glory of the world to come; through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who loves and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. # **March Council Highlights**

<u>Covid 19 Updates -</u> It has been a long and difficult two years of living with the Covid-19 pandemic in our midst. Throughout it, we have made difficult decisions about guidelines; with the health and safety of our worship community and beyond, and our call to love our neighbor, foremost in our minds. While Covid 19 is still a concern, things appear to be looking up, and for that, we are so grateful.

On Sunday morning after worship, Nativity Lutheran Church Council met to review our mask policy. This discussion and decision came after the CDC released new guidelines. We looked at the CDC's Community Level Chart. Levels can be low, medium, or high and are determined by looking at hospital beds being used, hospital admissions, and the total number of new COVID-19 cases in an area.

Allegheny County's level is currently low.

The CDC's guideline for county's whose level is low (green)...

People may choose to mask at any time. People with symptoms, or exposure to someone with Covid 19 should wear a mask.

After prayerful discussion, the council decided to follow the CDC's recommendations for the guidelines here at Nativity. Our new guidelines are...

Masks are optional while in the building with others. If you have symptoms, or have had exposure to someone with Covid 19, we ask that you wear a mask. Please continue to monitor any symptoms you may have, and stay home if you're feeling unwell.

Let us also remember that everyone has different comfort levels when it comes to concerns over Covid safety; especially in regards to wearing a mask and keeping a comfortable distance between households.

This new policy is effective immediately.

Council will continue to discuss and review this each month, and as need arises.






#### **Lenten Bible Study**



# March 2022 Kantor Korner

Each season brings its changes. Spring is no exception. With the change comes Lent. This year it begins with the imposition of ashes on March 2nd. The original meaning of Lent means "Lengthening" in Old English. Our days are "lengthening" more with the passing of the sun.

Our liturgy reflects the changes, too. One of which is the inclusion of ELW Hymn 602 "Your Heart, O God is Grieved" *Nzame to, Pane Boze Nas.* It serves as a Lenten Kyrie at the beginning of the service. It is a welcome change. It is rather dear to me. Back in 1975, I

collaborated on this Slovak Chorale with my cousin, Jaroslav Vajda. We call him "Jerry." With a name like "Jaroslav" you can see why. He did the translation from the Slovak language and I set the harmonization to *Zname to, Pane Boze Nas.* 

"Jerry" was a magnificent poet both in the English and Slovak language. Several of his hymns are also included in the ELW:

ELW 285 "Peace Comes to Earth"

ELW 460 "Now the Silence"

ELW 543 "Go, My children, With My Blessing"

ELW 740 "God of the Sparrow"

ELW 795 "God, My Lord, My Strength"

Some of these are Slovak, or with hymn tunes composed by his buddy-Carl Schalk, or even Welsh Tunes mixed in. Maybe Jerry and I related so well because we were related. My great-grandmother and his mother were sisters from the Hazelton area.

The pastor will sing the opening of "Your Heart, O God is Grieved" and the congregation will respond with each stanza to the Holy Trinity. Yes, Lent brings it changes of contemplation upon our Lord's suffering and death and this hymn reflects this so well.

This year, Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, falls on March 2. During worship services that day, pastors in many Christian churches dip a finger in ashes (often made by burning branches from the previous Palm Sunday) and make a cross on parishioners' foreheads.

Why ashes? Traditionally, they're a sign of mourning, humiliation and penitence. Ashes also represent the frailty and temporary nature of human life ("You are dust, and to dust you shall return," Genesis 3:19). Christians are pained because our sins led to Jesus' death. With repentant hearts, we begin the season of Lent, knowing that it leads to Jesus'

resurrection on Easter Sunday.

<u>A prayer for Lent:</u> Merciful God, accompany our journey through these forty days. renew us in the gift of baptism, that we may provide for those who are poor, pray for those in need, fast from self-indulgence, and above all that we may find our treasure in the life of your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen (ELW, pg. 254)


